



Lamberts Farm – Safety Policy

Lambert Farm is a very important part of the college estates, which covers 800 hectares across the South Downs National Park. The farm is operated as a commercial enterprise and is used extensively for educational purposes across a wide range of levels.

This document is additional to the Plumpton College Health and Safety Policy.

Please adhere to the following guidelines:

1. You must always wash your hands after being on the farm and before eating or drinking.
2. Food and drink must not be consumed on the farm
3. The farm has uneven surfaces, take care, do not run and noise must be kept to a minimum
4. Do not climb on walls, fences, gates, animal pens, machinery or bales of hay or straw.
5. Appropriate clothing and suitable footwear should be worn at all times
6. Wash your footwear on entering and leaving the farm
7. All accident, incidents or near hits must be reported to a Plumpton College staff member
8. Do not feed the animals
9. Always stay with your group
10. Be aware of farm vehicle traffic
11. Respect our guidelines around restricted access, this is for the safety of visitors and for the welfare of our animals.
12. PREGNANT WOMEN: if you are pregnant, or think you may be pregnant, we advise that you do not visit the farm during lambing season.
